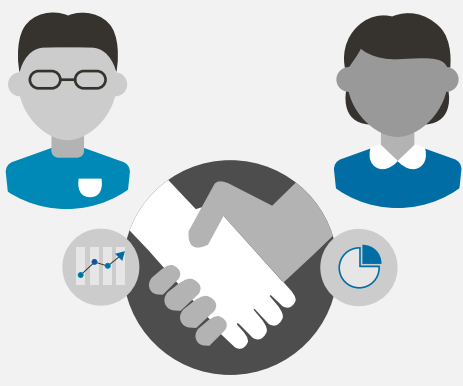


Diversity in Schools Improves Learning Outcomes

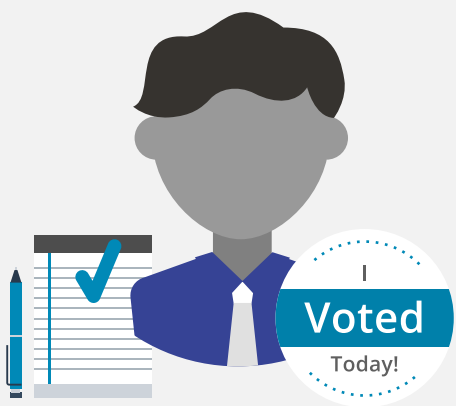
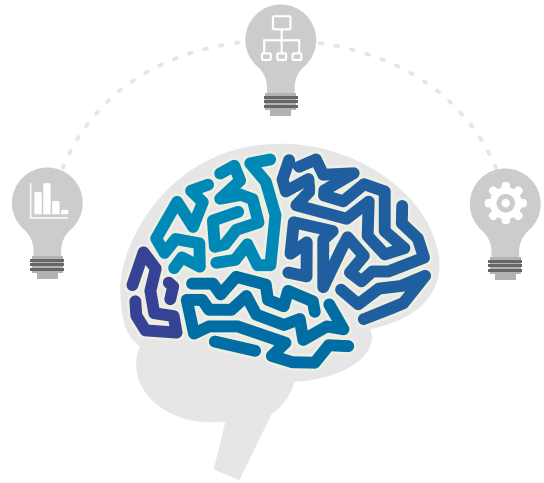


More Tolerance

Diverse learning environments develop better citizens who have a greater sense of civic engagement and participate more in community activities, such as volunteering.¹

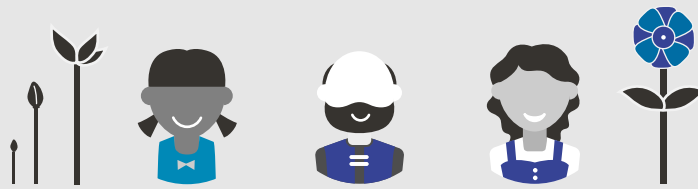
More Successful Employees
